SUBSTATION UPGRADES

Appalachian Power representatives plan upgrades to the electric transmission system in the town of Independence. The Independence Area Project: Substation Upgrades involves building a substation and relocating a transmission line into the substation. These upgrades support future plans to bring an additional electrical source to the area. Plans also include repurposing the existing Independence Substation to provide internet access as part of the broadband pilot program with Grayson County. Company representatives expect construction to begin in 2025.

The project proposes:

- · Building the Point Lookout Substation
- Relocating a transmission line from the existing Independence Substation to the proposed Point Lookout Substation
- Repurposing the Independence Substation to provide broadband internet access to area residents

WHY


Project benefits include:


- Supporting future plans to bring an additional electrical source to the area

The upgrades are located along Austin Street, off of North Independence Avenue/Route 21.








TYPICAL SUBSTATIONS
