

Wildwood Commerce Transmission Project



Appalachian Power plans to increase economic growth in southwestern Virginia by providing power to the Wildwood Commerce Park (WCP) in Carroll County, Virginia. The Wildwood Commerce Transmission Project consists of building about 3 miles of transmission line and a substation. The proposed line will tap Appalachian Power's existing Jacksons Ferry – Pipers Gap transmission line in the northern part of the county. The proposed routes will head southwest across Poplar Camp and Wildcat roads to the new substation in the park. The WCP is located east of Interstate 77 off Stuart Drive. Construction will not start until the WCP secures a customer, and is expected to last approximately 12 months.

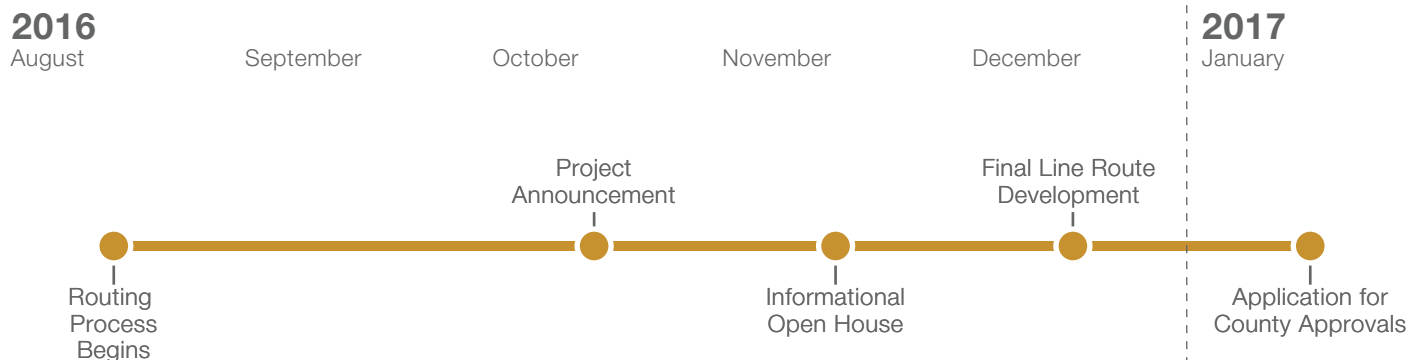
Typical Structures^{*}

Structures along the route will be about 100 feet tall. The typical right-of-way will be 100 feet wide. Appalachian Power is committed to carefully balancing the energy needs of homes and businesses while protecting the environment and natural beauty of the region.

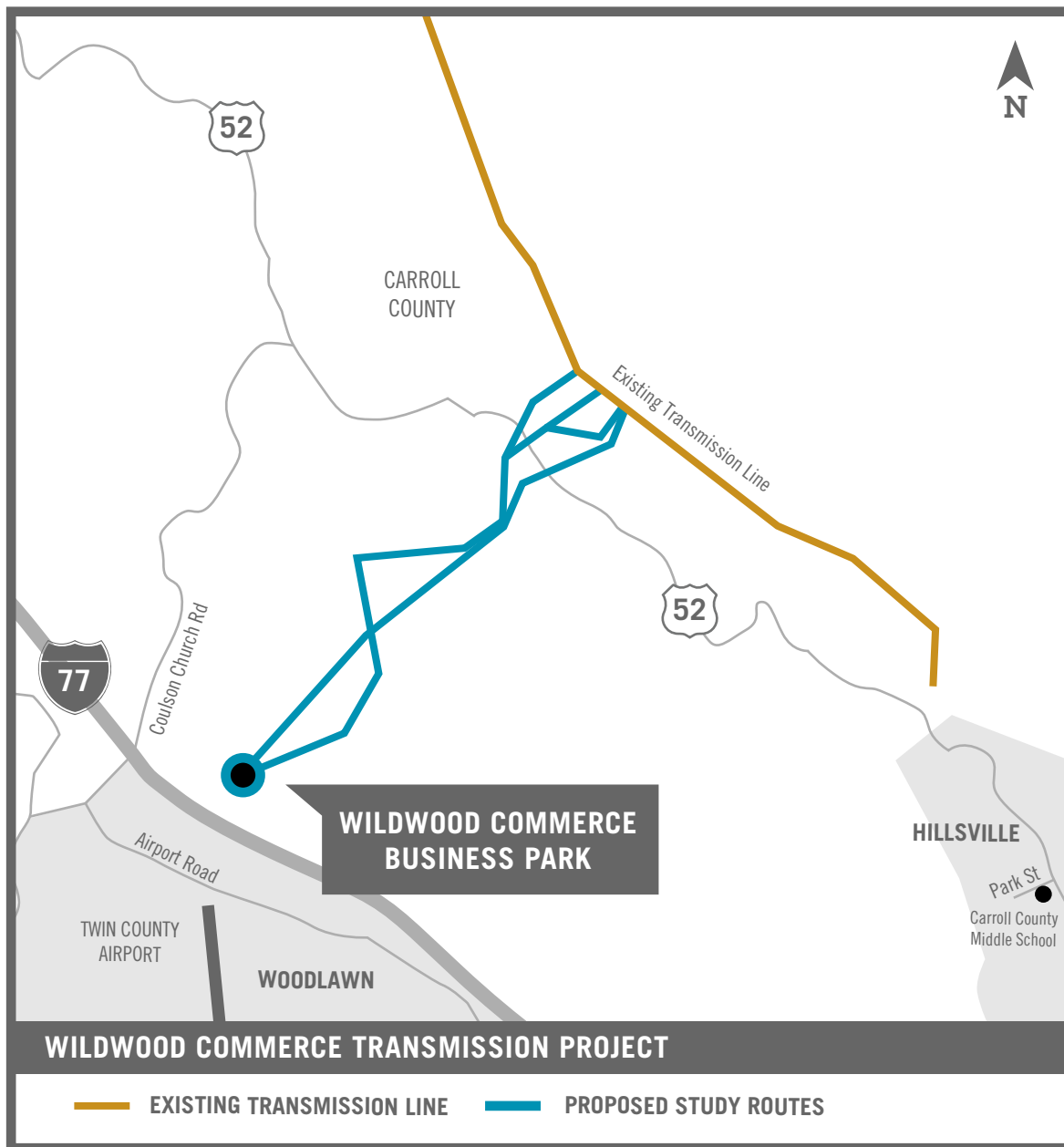


Project Schedule^{*}
